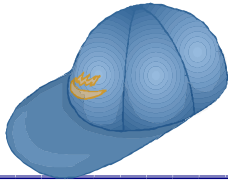
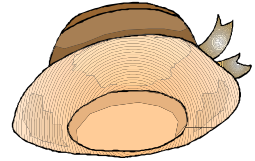
Heavenly Hats

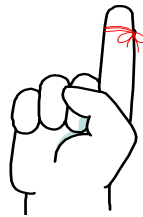

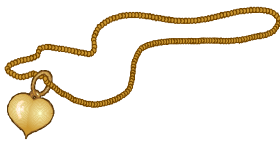

JENNIE AWARD



The Jennie Award is the highest personal honor GFWC can bestow upon a club member. Named for Jane (Jennie) Cunningham Crowley, this award will be given to eight club women, one from each region, at the 2010 GFWC International Convention in Omaha, Nebraska. Each club is encouraged to choose an outstanding member and fill out the application form found in your Club Manual.

Important considerations for choosing a candidate include her club activities, participation in community affairs, and commitment to family concerns. Each state may nominate one candidate to the regional president. Each region selects two nominations from all their applicants for a total of sixteen to be sent to GFWC. GFWC selects one candidate from each region, and all eight will be recognized at the 2010 GFWC

Convention in Omaha, Nebraska.

Clubs that sent an application for the 2008 nominee that was not the state winner may submit her name for the 2010 Jennie Award. Send application to Nell Rider, GFWC/Iowa President by June 15, 2009.

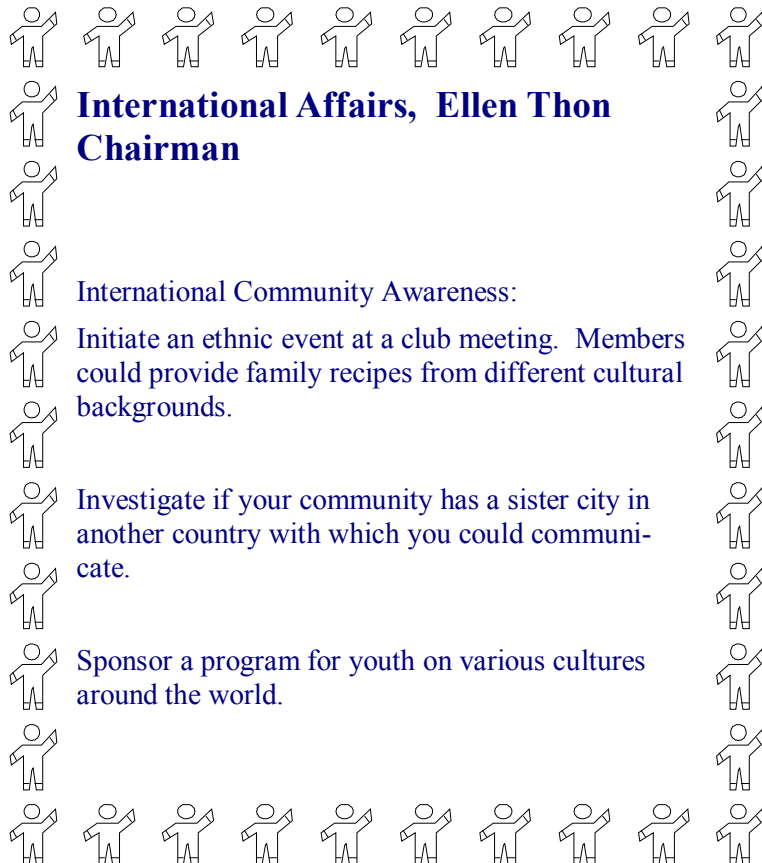

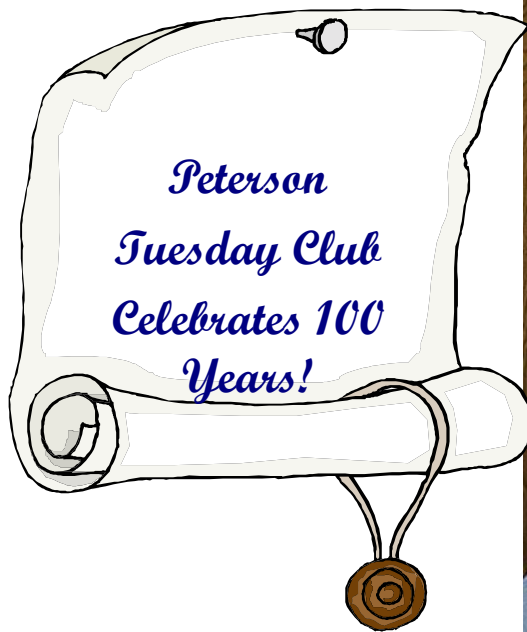

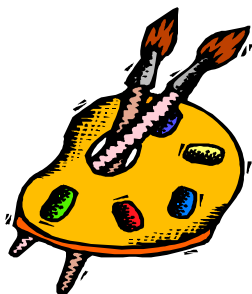

Conservation—Resource Conservation, Margaret Sadgepour-Kramer, State Chairman

Global warming—a recent concern. Evidence includes the following:

- ▶ Sea temperatures have risen by on average 0.5 degrees C (0.9 degree F) over the last 40 years [Tim Barnett, Scripps Institution of Oceanography in La Jolla, California]
- ▶ 20,000 square kilometers of fresh water ice melted in the Arctic between 1965 and 1995 [Ruth Curry, Woods Hole Oceanographic Institution in Connecticut]
- ▶ Worldwide measurements from tidal gauges indicate that global mean sea level has risen between 10 and 25 cm (18 cm average) during the last 100 years [Warrick et al., 1996]
- ▶ Global surface temperatures have risen about 0.7°C in the past 100 years [Met Office]
11 of the last 12 years rank amongst the 12 warmest years on record for global temperatures (since 1850) [IPCC, 2007]
- ▶ Since 1975, the increase of the 5-year mean temperature is about 0.5°C - a rate that is faster than for any previous period of equal length [NASA, 1999]
- ▶ Average annual temperature in the Arctic has increased by about 1° C over the last century -- a rate that is approximately double that of global average temperatures [IPCC, 1998]
- ▶ There is widespread evidence that glaciers are retreating in many mountain areas of the world. For example, since 1850 the glaciers of the European Alps have lost about 30 to 40% of their surface area and about half of their volume. (www.CarbonFootprint.com) Closer to home, Alaskan glaciers are rapidly shrinking.

Proposed By-Laws Changes

Article VIII Section 2 page 55. Chairmen of the departments shall present their program at the first board meetings of the new administration, and may, in accordance with the chairmen of the program area and the president, bring such work to completion through legislation, both state and federal. Each chairman shall keep a full record of the work done in the department, and shall deliver the record to her successor within one month after the expiration of her term of office taking a receipt thereof.

Proposed to read: Article VIII Section 2 page 55. Chairmen of the departments shall present their program at the first board meetings of the new administration, and may, in accordance with the chairmen of the program area and the president, bring such work to completion through legislation, both state and federal. Each chairman shall keep a full record of the work done in the department, and shall deliver the record to her successor within one month after the expiration of her term of office.

Rationale: to comply with current procedure.

Article IX. Section 4 Page 55 Paragraph 4. The headquarters secretary shall be paid a salary to be determined by the Board of Directors. GFWC/Iowa Officers and Appointees shall submit pre-approved bills, with vouchers, as allowed in the budget, to the GFWC/Iowa Treasurer, prior to the end of the fiscal year (June 30) in which expenses occur.

Proposed to read: The headquarters secretary shall be paid a salary to be determined by the Board of Directors. GFWC/Iowa Officers and appointees shall submit pre-approved bills with vouchers, as allowed in the budget, to the GFWC/Iowa Treasurer, within 60 days or sooner of the incurred expense and prior to the end of the fiscal year (June 30) in which expenses occur.

Rationale: to comply with bills being presented with a time frame.

Article XI Section 3(d) page 56. All officers of the district shall deliver to their successor, not later than June 1st, all records including District Director's materials, Secretary and Treasurer books and all other property belonging to the district, taking a receipt thereof.

Proposed to read: All officers of the district shall deliver to their successor, not later than June 1st, all records including District Director's materials, Secretary and Treasurer books and all other property belonging to the district.

Rationale: to comply with current procedure.

Article XII Section I page 57. The GFWC/Iowa Federation shall hold an annual convention in the month of April or May. The board of directors shall determine the place of meeting in uneven years, and in even years it shall be determined by a systematic rotation of the eight districts in logical order approved by the board and printed in the Bluebook. The hostess district shall cooperate with the state president in arrangements for the convention and shall follow the outline of customary procedure on file at headquarters. The "Call to Convention" and delegate credential cards shall be mailed from headquarters four (4) weeks before each annual convention. Credential cards shall be properly signed and returned with registration. Duplicates will not be issued.

Proposed to read: The GFWC/Iowa Federation shall hold an annual convention in the month of April or May. The board of directors shall determine the place of meeting in uneven years, and in even years it shall be determined by a systematic rotation of the eight districts in logical order approved by the board and printed in the Bluebook. The hostess district shall cooperate with the state president in arrangements for the convention and shall follow the outline of customary procedure on file at headquarters. The "Call to Convention:" shall be mailed from headquarters four (4) weeks before each annual convention. Credential cards shall be presented when delegates register at state convention. Duplicates will not be issued.

Rationale: to comply with GFWC procedures.

Article XII Section 2 page 57. Registration Fee. All delegates, members, and visitors attending the annual convention shall register, and pay a registration fee recommended by the executive committee and approved by the board of directors. This shall be paid directly into the state Federation treasury and used toward the expense of the convention as directed by the board of directors.

Proposed to read: Registration Fee. All delegates, members, and visitors attending the annual convention shall register, and pay a registration fee recommended by the executive committee and approved by the board of directors. This shall be paid directly into the state Federation treasury and used toward the expense of the convention as directed by the board of directors. Guests at the installation banquet in even numbered years will be exempt from the registration fee.

Rationale: to clarify guest registration fee.

From the south (via I-235 E)

1. Keep **straight** onto I-35 North 3.5 mi
