Recap of GFWC Annual Convention



What a Wonderful Week We Had!

I have had the honor to attend four GFWC Annual Conventions, and each year I come back to Iowa and say to myself, “Wow, that’ll be hard to top!” Yet each year the convention keeps getting better.

Nine GFWC/Iowa members traveled to Scottsdale, AZ and gathered at the stunning Westin Kierland Resort & Spa for a week filled with 900 extraordinary Federation members, inspirational speakers, valuable workshops and opportunities to reconnect with old friends, and create lasting memories with new ones.

We were inspired by the exceptional speakers who explored the evolving role of women in leadership and honored the contributions and stories of servicewomen in shaping our nation’s history. We listened to Chief Warrant Officer Five Phyllis J. Wilson

speak of the challenges and prejudices she overcame to become the most senior Warrant Officer in the United State Army Reserve, as well as being a key member of the Executive Team, managing an organization of more than 200,000 personnel. She is currently the President of the Women in Military Service for America Memorial Foundation – the only major national memorial honoring the three million women who have defended America from the Revolutionary War to today. There were eight different workshops, each of them

offering practical tools, innovative ideas and fresh strategies designed to strengthen leadership and explore new approaches to tackle the challenges that clubs are experiencing. These workshops left us empowered, informed and energized.

This will probably sound boring, but one of my favorite things to learn about is legislation and public policy. Collectively, we reviewed and voted on proposed resolutions so that our lobbyists and leaders can continue making an impact on Capitol Hill and maintain our success of advocating for women, children, and the underserved. A few of the resolutions we worked on were related to domestic and sexual violence awareness and prevention, military sexual assault, sexual assault evidence collection (i.e. rape kits),

sexual exploitation of children and gun control/firearms safety.

GFWC has ten affiliate organizations, the latest being Safe Surfin' Foundation, whose aim is to help keep everyone safe from online predators, especially children. We were fortunate to hear from each of GFWC's affiliate organizations during a lunchtime panel discussion. GFWC's affiliate organizations are:

We were all beaming with pride when the state of Iowa received the Creativity Award for the top ten projects we submitted related to Advocates for Children. GFWC/Iowa also received an award for membership retention, plus the Yorel Study Club received the Creativity Award for the program they did on health and wellness. Bravo, Yorel and GFWC/Iowa!

Lots of pageantry was on display during the final night's installation banquet, where we witnessed Wendy Carriker being installed as the 56th GFWC International President. GFWC/

Iowa President Ann Zlabek walked in the state processional formation leading up to the installation, and to say the evening was a grand affair is an understatement.

By the close of the convention, we all carried home far more than memories. We left with renewed purpose, fresh ideas, strengthened friendships and an even greater commitment to the mission we all share, *"Living the Volunteer Spirit"*.

"Children are among the most vulnerable members of our communities, and the GFWC Juniors' Special Program: Advocates for Children challenges club members to be a voice on their behalf. Open to all clubs, this program encourages members to make a meaningful difference in the lives of children through advocacy, education and service.

Through this program, GFWC members work to ensure children are safe from harm, promote healthy physical and emotional development, and support policies that improve children's lives. The program also emphasizes educating parents and caregivers about resources that help them advocate for children's safety and well-being.

Clubs are encouraged to support children experiencing challenges such as abuse, cyberbullying, depression, homelessness, poverty, foster care, human trafficking and serious illness. Initiatives promoting healthy habits, including limiting screen time and discouraging texting while driving, are also key components of the program." -

Possible DSVAP Projects

Mickey Coonfare, Domestic/Sexual Violence Awareness/Prevention Chairman

I would like to encourage all members to sign up for the **Legislative Action Center**. During the month of June, we had two alerts. The first was User Age – Verification and Responsible Dialogue Act requiring verifiable age checks before access to AI chatbots and prohibiting minors from using AI companions that stimulate emotional or romantic attachment. The second was Kids Online Safety Act. This is a powerful tool to alert GFWC members about pending legislation and an easy way to let our voices be heard.

The seven areas under Domestic and Sexual Violence Awareness and Prevention are: 1) Campus Sexual Assault, 2) Child Abuse, 3) Elder Abuse, 4) Intimate

Partner Violence, 5) Military Sexual Assault, 6) Teen Dating, 7) Violence Against Native American Women.

I encourage clubs to plan a project related to one of these focus areas, even if your meeting schedules are already set. I hope your club will be able to have a project that will fall under one of these areas: donating to a shelter; creating comfort items for deputies to give children in difficult situations; posting teen dating information in local restrooms; connecting with the *Iowa Coalition Against Domestic Violence*, www.icadv.org/ or *Iowa Coalition Against Sexual Assault*, www.iowacasa.org/.

I am a committee member for the national Domestic and Sexual Violence Awareness



and Prevention program. I will be sharing information at the Mississippi Valley Region meeting and am encouraging everyone to attend.

We encourage everyone to **STAND UP, SPEAK UP and SHOW UP**. At upcoming meetings, I will encourage everyone to raise awareness, offer support and move closer to a world without violence.

Grow Your Club

Maintaining and increasing membership has always been important to the strength and longevity of a club. Today, I'd like to change that conversation to help you grow your club.

Our club reports, news articles and newsletter articles

have always relied on what has been accomplished in hours, dollars and what services have been provided. What if instead of that, we think of how our efforts impacted our community?

Below are two examples from my own club:

Example 1

Members of the Solon Women's Club fundraised and wrote a grant to secure nearly \$2,000 toward the purchase of a 3-way drinking fountain to be installed at the Solon Recreational Park Area. The drinking fountain will provide water to refill water bottles, for drinking and has a lower-level dish for pets.



Example 2

Members of the Solon Women's Club have improved the lives of those running, walking, and participating in school and recreational sports at the Solon Recreational Park. The club provided funding toward a modern drinking fountain that is set up to refill water bottles, drink from and provide water for pets. The park previously had only a concession stand open for limited hours during school baseball games. Thousands of area children will now have access to readily available water at no cost. Fresh and cooled water is vital to maintain health and prevent heat-related illness, especially during the hot summer months. An estimated 600 youngsters and spectators participate weekly in sporting events during April thru July (peak season) at the park. In addition, water will be more readily available, should an emergency situation arise, for a child or parent at the facility.

The first example is service oriented; the second is impact related. Ask yourself, if someone reads this, will they admire us or might they want to join us?

When we lead with impact in reporting, news articles and publicity, we do more than describe GFWC,

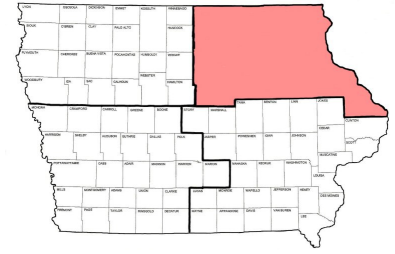

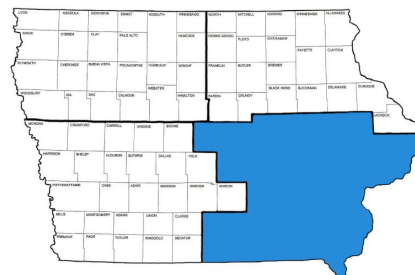

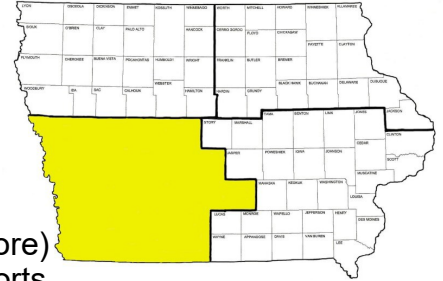
